THEIR WIDOWS AND ORPHANS,

Of the late Armies of the United States, Residing in the State of Kansas.

The above questions will be asked by the assessor, and if the person is liable to be enrolled under the provisions of Senate bill No. 204, approved March 2, 1889, the answer will be written in the proper place.

Section seven of the law is as follows: "SEC. 7. Any county clerk, township trustee, or city or ward assessor, who shall fail or refuse to perform any of the duties required of him by this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offense."

If a soldier served in more than one regiment, the assessor will make a separate enumeration for each.

Under the provisions of this act, only Union soldiers of the late war, and their widows and orphans, will be enrolled.
